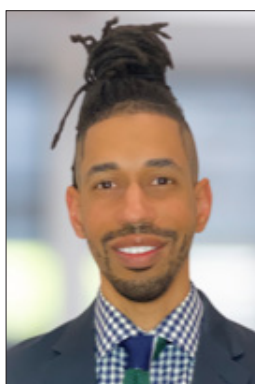

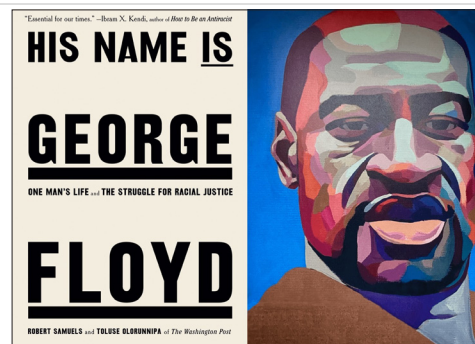

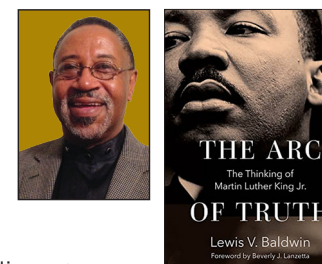


Join the archivists and collection director for a special viewing of papers from the Martin Luther King Jr. Collection, including individual, family and organizational records housed in the center.
