

President Truman signs Executive Order to end segregation in the Armed Forces.

MLK, Jr. graduates from Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA.

1948

Brown v. Board of Education: US Supreme Court rules segregated schools unconstitutional.

1954

Little Rock Nine Black youth enroll at all-white Central High School in Little Rock, AK.

SCLC Founded in Atlanta. With MLK, Jr. as first president.

President Eisenhower signs Civil Rights Act into law to protect voter rights.

First 2 Black students: Dorcas Jernigan & Sallie Mae Robertson enroll at Monroe Area High School (MAHS).

Bloody Sunday: Selma to Montgomery March in Alabama

President Johnson signs Voting Rights Act to prevent literacy tests as a voting requirement.

1965

First 2 Black students graduate from MAHS.

1967

1951

Monroe Rotary Club invites Black children for the first time to their Annual Christmas Party.

1955

14-year old Emmett Till lynched in MS.

Rosa Parks refuses to give up her seat, prompting Montgomery Bus Boycott.

1949

Citizens Committee, lead by Dan Young, petitions for equal education rights to Walton County School Board.

1959

Citizens Committee, lead by Dan Young, again files complaint for conditions at Black schools to Walton County School Board.

1961

CORE Freedom Rides through the South prompting violence from white protestors.

Monroe City Council appropriates \$10,000 to recreation department for white residents, and \$1,200 for summer recreational program for Black youth.

1964

Bolton's Restaurant in Monroe. GA refuses to serve Black protesters.

Monroe City Council imposes curfew ordinance in response to protests.

MLK, Jr. receives Nobel Peace Prize.


President Johnson signs Civil Rights Act into law preventing employee discrimination due to race, color sex, religion or national origin.

1968

MLK JR. assassinated at age 39 in Memphis, TN.

President Johnson signs Fair Housing Act providing equal opportunity housing regardless of race, religion or national origin.

Graves v Walton County Board of **Education Law Suit Prompts** Integration of Schools in Walton County.



Anthony Pitch renews petition to unseal documents. Government confirmed records must remain sealed.

FBI closes its reopened case on the Moore's Ford Lynching.

Lynn McKinley Jackson case re-opened by Walton County Sheriff's Department

2015

Moore's Ford Grand Jury Testimony Document Unsealing Granted by US 11th Circuit District Court.

Aug 18 – US District Judge Marc Treadwell agreed to release grand jury transcripts to enhance the historical record of the tragic event.

2017

Monroe resident and historic preservationist Elizabeth Jones begins Zion Hill Cemetery restoration efforts with community volunteers.

Jan 8 – Civil Rights Cold Case Records Collection Act of 2018 signed into law by President Donald Trump.

Feb 11 – 3-Judge panel of the 11th US Circuit Court of Appeals ruled 2-1 to uphold the District Court's order.

June 4 - 11th Circuit Court of Appeals, after polling, decides that Pitch vs. USA will be re-heard En Banc in October.

July 6 – Anthony Pitch dies. His wife, Marion Pitch, and author Laura Wexler are named petitioners on the case.

Oct 22 – US 11th Circuit Court Hears Petition En Banc from attorney Joseph Bell in Atlanta, GA.

Letter of Moore's Ford Lynching Acknowledgement presented to Monroe City Council by Mayor John Howard.

2014

Feb 3 - Author Anthony Pitch petitioned the US District Court for the Middle District of GA to order unsealing the 1946 Moore's Ford Lynching Grand Jury Transcripts.

Aug 19 - Judge dismissed petition without prejudice as there was no evidence that the transcripts existed.

2016

Anthony Pitch publishes "The Last Lynching" book. After book is published, he discovers 6 boxes of documents containing 4,800 page of transcripts related to the Moore Ford Lynching Case in the National Archives in Washington D.C.

Roger Hayes (son of Moore's Ford Lynching victim Roger Malcom) died April 15, 2016 in Ohio, where he was moved to avoid threat of death after the killing of his father.

2018

GBI closes its re-opened case on the Moore's Ford Lynching.

US Dept of Justice attempts to stop Grand Jury Testimony Unsealing; 11th Circuit Court of Appeals upholds lower Court's decision but requests rehearing.

First Black Debutante inducted in the Debutants of Monroe organization that previously prohibited black inductees.

Monroe welcome signs containing the confederate flag symbol representing the Sons of Confederate Veterans organization are removed by the City of Monroe.

2020

US 11th Circuit Court overrules previous decision to release Grand Jury Testimonies from the Moore's Ford Lynching case.

Attorney Joseph Bell files writ of certiorari to Supreme Court of the US to unseal Moore's Ford Lynching Testimonies.

George Floyd is killed by Minneapolis police officer and protests erupt across the US, including several days of protests in downtown Monroe, GA.

Fighting Oppression and Racism in Monroe (FORM) writes petition for the removal of the confederate monument on the Walton County Courthouse Square.

Monroe Diversity Council formed by Mayor of Monroe, John Howard. Council presents recommendations to City Council including Acknowledgement of Moore's Ford Lynching.
